CLINICAL CONSULTATION

Dr. Stenquist has performed over 3000 examinations in over 25 years of clinical practice representing all areas of diagnosis and patient care. His primary involvement for many years in medical care for HIV/AIDS spectrum patients brought him into contact with both focal and diffuse neurological vectors of all varieties, from neoplasms, such as CNS Lymphoma, PML, and Astrocytomas, to infectious conditions, such as Cerebral Toxoplasmosis and Cryptococcal Meningitis, to chronic, degenerative diseases, such as HIV and CMV Encephalopathy. He has also examined numerous patients suffering from Traumatic Brain Injury, cerebrovascular conditions and dementias of aging. Patients have also represented all varieties of psychiatric conditions, including psychosis, affective disorders, anxiety disorders, somatoform disorders and PTSD among others. He is familiar with all major extraneous factors in testing such as malingering, pain and concurrent treatment with analgesic, psychiatric and other medications. He has provided clinical diagnosis in both inpatient and outpatient settings. In 2007 he was invited by Oxford University Press to be among the reviewers of the 4th Edition of *Neuropsychological Assessment* (Lezak, Howison & Loring, 2004), in preparation for the next edition of one of the seminal texts in the field of Clinical Neuropsychology. His clinical patients have ranged from Academy Award recipients and household names, to homeless schizophrenics, one memorably presenting with a pilfered street sign as his 'writing tablet'.

FORENSIC CONSULTATION

Dr. Stenquist has consulted on all neurocognitive and neuroaffective aspects of personal injury, disability, patient veracity and testamentary and contractual capacity.
